APPLICATION GUIDELINES 2018

What are Folk Camps?

Folk Camps Society is a charity that has been running for more than 50 years, with the aim of preserving and passing on 'The Folk Tradition'. With an emphasis on participation and creating a community, we offer a variety of camping holidays across Britain in beautiful locations, where volunteer staff help organise and lead musical activities, with daily workshops, singarounds and ceilidhs. Our summer week-long camps include all meals, with everyone lending a hand at the necessary chores. We also run self cater weekend and special themed camps.

What does the Bursary scheme offer?

We are offering the opportunity to experience a Folk Camps holiday for the cost of a deposit, only £20. The balance is paid by the Bursary. This is worth up to £260 (for a week long fully catered summer camp). All camping holidays in the current year's programme are included in the scheme (except winter hotel-based holidays), from fully-catered summer holiday weeks to short, themed workshop weekends. A bursary is a great opportunity for you to develop your musicianship, perhaps in learning new repertoire, perhaps in honing your workshop skills.

What is the aim of the bursaries?

We hope that the **Discover Bursaries** will help us to increase the number of folk artists who attend our camps. In return, we hope that you will have the experience of a lifetime, make friends, learn some new skills, network (many Folk Campers also organise festivals and clubs), tell people you know about us, and return another year. Part of our charitable purpose is to preserve and pass on the folk traditions of the British Isles. We want more people to know about Folk Camps, about our great holidays and the role they can play in preserving and developing traditional music, song and dance.

With the **Promote Bursaries**, we are keen to improve our publicity and marketing to the Folk world outside Folk Camps. We are also very keen to involve more Folk Campers in substantive roles.

What do I have to do if I am offered a bursary?

There is no obligation on the recipient of a **Discover Bursary** to carry out any specific camp activity, other than participating with the usual duties that all campers need to do. We greatly value the volunteering ethos that lies at the heart of Folk Camps. However, we know that the way to get the most out of our holidays is to participate as much as possible, so you will be encouraged to learn and share during your holiday. If you have a wonderful time – and we are confident that you will – we would love you to tell your friends about us and spread the word. All the camp staff are volunteers, so maybe one day you'll decide to join them!

If you are offered a **Promote Bursary**, we expect you to carry out your project to the timescale as agreed with the Bursary Co-ordinator.

Who can apply?

Discover: New to Folk Camps, adults aged 18+, active in a Folk tradition (musician, caller, singer, dancer...)

Promote: Adults aged 18+, open to both new to Folk Camps and existing Folk Campers
